# PHI BETA DELTA HONOR SOCIETY FOR INTERNATIONAL SCHOLARS

PHI BETA DELTA FACT SHEET

In 1985, the Center for International Education (CIE) at California State University, Long Beach (CSULB) wanted to recognize formally the academic achievements of international students, U.S. students returning from study abroad, international scholars, support staff in international education, and faculty engaged in scholarly international endeavors. The CIE staff examined the described activity of existing national honor societies and found none which appropriately addressed these populations, or specifically focused on the international experience. Therefore, a campus committee was formed, headed by Edward Blankenship, Director of CIE, and Karl W.E. Anatol, Dean of Humanities, to develop an honor society which would focus on international education and exchange, and also serve as a catalyst for international programming.

Phi Beta Delta Honor Society for International Scholars (PBD) was founded on the campus of California State University, Long Beach (CSULB). As a result of the enthusiasm of the new members of this honor society and of the university's administration, several other universities heard of the forming of Phi Beta Delta and became interested in forming chapters on their campuses.

Although it was not in the original plan to consider the development of a national honor society, directors Blankenship and Anatol realized from the requests and interest of individuals at other institutions that this organization would be a valuable asset to other campuses. Therefore, the organizing committee at CSULB went back to work and investigated methods for forming a national honor society. After much research and discussion, it was decided that the chapter at CSULB would be designated as the Alpha Chapter. The Alpha Chapter then invited a number of institutions throughout the U.S. to consider forming chapters. The end result was that 38 institutions were authorized by the Alpha chapter to form charter chapters.



May 22, 1987, the chapter coordinators from these 38 charter institutions met in Long Beach, California to establish Phi Beta Delta as a national honor society. In order to recognize scholarly achievement and leadership in international education and exchange, delegates at the first meeting decided that this new society would publish a refereed journal, organize annual national conferences, and recognize outstanding individuals through scholarships and awards.

On June 2-3, 2017, PBD will continue this tradition of celebrating excellence and achievements in international education by scholars, students, faculty and staff. PBD's 31st Annual Conference will be held at its campus of birth, California State University Long Beach, proudly hosted by the Alpha Chapter.

PBD presently hosts 58 active chapters, representing 21 states in the US, and an active chapter in Bulgaria. California State University San Bernardino (CSUSB) serves as the current PBD headquarters.

CHAPTER NEWS

Omicron - California State University, Sacramento

This year, in honor of International Women's Day, the Uffizi Gallery launched a new initiative that projects an exhibition of art by women each March, using works from its permanent collection and elsewhere. The first woman to be honored this way also has been called the first woman painter of Florence. Plautilla Nelli, a Dominican nun, was active as both an artist and the administrator of an art workshop in her Florentine convent in the second half of the sixteenth century. Although famous in her lifetime and

often mentioned in the centuries that followed, she has not had a “solo show” until this year.

I have been studying Nelli for just over two decades, gradually reconstructing her career and establishing a body of work for her. Other scholars also have played an important role in this project, most notably Dr. Fausta Navarro, the curator of this year’s Uffizi exhibition. She has found a series of portraits of the saint for whom Nelli’s convent was named, Catherine of Siena. These form the core of the Uffizi show, which is called “Plautilla Nelli: Art and Devotion in Savonarola’s Footsteps” (March 8-June 4, 2017).

Girolamo Savonarola, a fifteenth-century Dominican friar from Ferrara (his birthplace was just two blocks from my husband’s home, where I am now), was very influential for Plautilla Nelli, her contemporaries, and her convent, whose founders were inspired by him. Ideas and beliefs expressed in his writings inform the art produced by Nelli, the members of her workshop, and other Dominican artist nuns in Tuscany in the 1500s.

The show's main sponsor, the Advancing Women Artists Foundation (AWA), has funded the restoration of several of the works of art included in the exhibition. It also created a film that is being shown in the Uffizi galleries, and which can be seen on Youtube: <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=B-uRmRsKKGI>

The staff of LdM News, a video publishing project of an international art school in Florence (Istituto Lorenzo de’ Medici), created a film after the show’s opening that shows many of the works on view. These include not only Nelli’s drawings and paintings, but also a selection of art and books by her contemporaries that are related to the exhibition’s theme (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=J9OrJ0o9O9A>).

The Colombian Peace Process and the Role of the Theater Arts

Lecture Description: On the 26th of September of 2016, after four fruitful years of intense negotiations in Havana, Cuba, and after more than a half century of armed conflict, the guerrilla forces of Las FARC and the government of Juan Manuel Santos have finally sat down to sign a peace accord. Throughout the conflict and the impending peace process, alongside the fighting elements and political actors, there have always been cultural activists who have carried out impressive artistic projects and poetic performances that engage with the voices of those who have lived the horrors of war. In this sense, it could be said that playwrights such as Patricia Ariza, Tino Fernandez and Carlos Satizabal, have channeled their artistic intervention towards a collective invention of peace: for they have acted as facilitators for a population that has for generations lived the everyday perturbation of war and its various forms of violence, and as guides now towards a collective adjustment to the idea of peace, justice and Memory.
