

AWARDS

Yvonne Captain Faculty Award for Outstanding Contributions to International Education

Dr. Ismael Montana, Northern Illinois University, Zeta Gamma Chapter. Dr. Montana was unable to attend the conference. Here is a photo of him receiving his award at NIU.



Associate Professor of History, at Northern Illinois University, Zeta Gamma Chapter. Dr. Montana teaches courses in World history, African history, and Islamic history. He founded and directs a summer program in Ghana, where he also leads a multi-year project to preserve endangered archives that are crucial to understanding the history of Ghana, slavery, and British colonialism.

Dr. Ismael is an internationally renowned scholar of African, Ottoman, and Mediterranean history, with numerous publications, including his 2013 book <u>The Abolition of Slavery in Ottoman Tunisia</u>. He has been recognized with awards by the Institute for Advanced Study in Berlin and the British Library. His diverse language skills include Hausa, Arabic, and French. And he has received invitations to speak in Mexico, Germany, Italy, Nigeria, Canada, the Niger, France, Morocco, and Brazil. Dr. Montana is on the editorial board of the *African Conflict and Peacebuilding Review* and the *Maghreb Review*. Dr. Montana has made major contributions to international education and is a great example of an international educator.

Marian Beane/Charles Gliozzo Domestic Student Award for International Achievement

Lexie Williams, Northern Illinois University, Zeta Gamma Chapter



Lexie is majoring in Public Health and is graduating with University Honors. She is a McKearn Fellow and an Honors Ambassador. Lexie took a course in Genocide Studies, which qualified her to participate in the study abroad program in The Hague: Peace, Justice, and the International Court. The program focuses on post-genocide justice and the effort to provide some recourse and healing to the victims and their societies. The program director praises Lexie for being "the consummate representative" during such activities like examining the Holocaust in Amsterdam, witnessing the trails in various courts in The Hague, and visits to diplomatic agencies and NGOs and meeting with lawyers, judges and victims to examine the scope and sequence of the pursuit of justice. Lexie currently actively promotes the program, sharing her views on the value of international experiences. Thus she has gone on to be a promoter of globalism, not just a consumer. We agree with Dr. J. D. Bowers, Director of the Honors College, that Lexie Williams is one of the strongest promoters of global studies and of international engagement.

Yashwant served on many leadership roles at Texas A&M. He is the primary advisor to the Golden Key International Honor Society, the facilitator for the 2017 Texas A&M Student Conference on Latino Affairs, and the founder and president of the Brazos Valley Worldfest Ambassador Program, which is designed to promote cultural diversity and global citizenship to create a more internationalized atmosphere on his campus. The recipient of the 2017 Eileen Evans Outstanding Chapter Award is the Eta Epsilon chapter at Western Illinois University (Midwest Region). The Eta Epsilon chapter held their annual induction on April 10, 2017, during which they welcomed 8 new members. Their chapter consists of 49 active members (11 international students, 6 U.S. students, 10 staff members, 13 faculty members, and 10 community member). The Eta Epsilon chapter officers meet once a month and organize 8 events annually, including invited talks, collaborative events with other international organizations, as well as service and volunteering events. The chapter is very active in fundraising. This academic year, Eta Epsilon held a scholarship dinner and participated in an international bazaar. The "Taste of India Scholarship Dinner" took place on November 12, 2016 right before the start of International Education Week. The event featured authentic Indian cuisine cooked by Indian students and Phi Beta Delta members. The event included a presentation about India, showcasing different dances, as well as a silent auction. Over \$1,000 was raised, half of which supports an international student scholarship, the other half a study abroad student scholarship. Additional funds for these two scholarships were raised during the 44th International Bazaar, held on March 4, 2017. In addition to promoting Phi Beta Delta, Eta Epsilon members made and sold out of Brazilian chocolate balls as well as authentic international items. Events like these help highlight the importance of global education and understanding, showcase Phi Beta Delta to the larger (campus) community, and serve as a great idea for other chapters to support their student members. The Eta Epsilon chapter embodies the goals of our Phi Beta delta organization and is very deserving of this honor.
