
Friday-Saturday: May 31-June 1st, 2019 Shepherd University, Shepherdstown, WV Innovative Strategies in Promoting Global Learning

The Phi Beta Delta Honor Society for International Scholars is pleased to announce that the <u>Spring 2019 conference</u> will be held at <u>Shepherd University</u> on May 31-June 1st, 2019.

Shepherd University is a public liberal arts institution located in the Eastern Panhandle of West Virginia alongside the Potomac River and beneath the beautiful Blue Ridge Mountains. Founded in 1871, the institution has a rich tradition in teacher education, business, health sciences, and the liberal arts. The university is situated within Shepherdstown, an old colonial town known for its quaint shops, coffee houses, and restaurants, and its status as a historic district on the National Register of Historic Places.

The oldest town in West Virginia, Shepherdstown was once considered as a possible national capital by our founding fathers. The university and town are located within a short distance of the C & O Canal National Park, Antietam National Battlefield, Harpers Ferry National Historical Park, the Appalachian Trail, and numerous other historic, cultural, and natural attractions. Shepherd University is home to the Robert C. Byrd Center for Congressional History and Education (and the Byrd Papers) and the George Tyler Moore Center for the Study of the Civil War. Lodging options include local motels as well as the university's new residence hall, Potomac Place. The local chapter of PBD extends a warm West Virginia welcome!

Omega Chapter California State University, Northridge

Alexis Krasilovsky, member of the Omega Chapter, Professor in the Department of Cinema and Television Arts, California State University, Northridge, served as an official delegate at the Dhaka International Film Festival, a Discussant for two keynote papers at the International Conference on Women in Cinema, a lecturer on the Heroine's Journey at the EMK (Edward Kennedy) Center, and a leader of a 5-day workshop on the Art and Craft of Screenplay Adaptation for the International Academy of Film and Television. They also screened the film that Prof. Krasilovsky wrote and directed, "Let Them Eat Cake" (2015), which was filmed in twelve countries over six years and won the Best Documentary Feature award from the Paris Independent Film Festival. ("Let Them Eat Cake" is Prof. Krasilovsky's second global documentary: the first, "Women Behind the Camera" [2007], won four Best Documentary awards. She is also the author of "Great Adaptations: Screenwriting and Global Storytelling" [Routledge: NY/London, 2018].)

Alpha Chi Chapter Creighton University

Phi Beta Delta, an honor society for international scholars, has returned to campus after years of inactivity. Creighton's provisional Alpha Chi Chapter, one of nearly 200 chapters worldwide, inducted four new members in April. Bob Marble, PhD, associate professor of business intelligence and analytics, himself initiated into Creighton's chapter in 1997, serves as its faculty moderator.

Senior Anri Rogers, a marketing, management and business intelligence and analytics triple major from Pearl City, Hawaii, was the catalyst for Phi Beta Delta's return. A semester she spent in Japan sparked an interest in learning about additional international opportunities. Initially, she sought to establish an international business club. But then she decided to aim higher and relaunch Phi Beta Delta.

The goals for Creighton's Phi Beta Delta chapter, says Rogers, are "to spearhead the creation of a vast global network of educators, scholars, students and employers for Creighton's staff, students, faculty and alumni. Our vision is to do this through collaborations with many globally focused student organizations on campus and by hosting speakers and events that are rooted in global citizenship."

"We are striving to make Creighton a more globally conversant campus, whether you are from an international country, have studied abroad or have a genuine interest in learning more about the world and its many cultures," says Lucy Hancock, international student and scholar services coordinator in the Office of Global Engagement and staff moderator of the Alpha Chi Chapter.

Hancock will be attending the Phi Beta Delta annual conference at Shepherd University in West Virginia in May. She was selected to present at the conference and will share ways in which Creighton infuses global perspectives into its programming on campus.

A global perspective is "catching on in higher education," says Marble. When he assumed the role of international programs advisor for the Heider College of Business in 2008, nine students were enrolled in spring 2009 semester abroad programs. That number has grown to 46 for spring 2019.

The honor society aims to host at least two social events a semester, as well as offering speaking engagements and working with other campus organizations and globally focused nonprofits in the Omaha area. But the benefits of

membership in Phi Beta Delta extend long after graduation, says Hancock, creating a lifelong professional network of other globally engaged individuals.

"This chapter is a gift that keeps on giving because of the connections and relationships that will evolve from merely being involved," she says.

Two other students, in addition to Rogers, were inducted into the Alpha Chi Chapter: Teresa Kooima, a senior majoring in sustainable energy, and Nhu Nguyen, a senior marketing and business intelligence and analytics double major. Hancock says recruitment efforts will intensify during the 2019-2020 academic year now that Phi Beta Delta is an official student organization.
